# THE JUAN IGNACIO MOLINA BUILDING

he CINV acknowledges that science can play a role in the socioeconomic rebirth of Valparaiso. Towards this aim, in addition to becoming a world-class center for neuroscience, the CINV also aims to move to the area of La Matriz in Valparaiso within the next few years. Integrating tradition, heritage, and excellence is part of the mission of the Universidad de Valparaiso, and is in line with having the CINV located at the heart of this historical area in Valparaiso.

This project seeks to recover and enhance the value of the Juan Ignacio Molina building, which is an emblematic real estate treasure in Valparaiso, located in an area declared a World Heritage site by UNESCO. By situating the CINV in a modern and innovative building, we aim to prove that a highly complex infrastructure containing scientific laboratories can be located in one of the most culturally valuable and historical areas in the city.

This project will also include an interactive exhibition space, which will serve to bring science closer to children and youth in the region. It will also have an auditorium with a capacity of 200 people, to hold scientific seminars, as well as cultural and outreach activities for the general public.

Around 150 Chilean and foreign researchers, students, and staff will be housed in this new building, which will bring the scientific spotlight on the CINV in Chile.

Through this initiative, the new CINV building will be the focus of high-quality science development. It will also seek to disseminate the work carried out in the CINV to different types of audiences, including scholars, students, children, community organizations, etc.

The renovation of this building considers the restoration of its original façade while giving life to this space, years after being a Jesuit residence in the XVII<sup>th</sup> century where the abbot, Juan Ignacio Molina lived, and which later housed the first Chilean bicameral Congress (in the XIX<sup>th</sup> century), among other historical events.
